A new study, unveiled at the Farm Show in Harrisburg January 12, is a new vision, based on three years of hard work by a team of ten experts. The 300 page study is the most complete research ever on the subject of White-tailed Deer in Pennsylvania.

"Managing White-tailed Deer in Forest Habitat From an Ecosystem Perspective: Pennsylvania Case Study" is something that you have to read if you're going to win any arguments about deer at your favorite watering hole. Yes, you gotta read it - and you have to read it with an open mind.
