In addition to working within the Kiski-Conemaugh River Basin and western PA on invasive species threats to biodiversity, such as Japanese knotweed, the Westsylvania Native Biodiversity Program is also initiating valuable collaboration with the Juniata Clean Water Partnership concerning its invasive species problems.
