In general, grants may be used for all appropriate expenses needed to complete a greenway project, including planning, technical assistance, legal, and other costs. Project examples include mapping, ecological assessments, surveying, conferences, and design activities; developing brochures, interpretative displays, audio-visual productions, or public opinion surveys; hiring consultants, incorporating land trusts, building a foot bridge, and planning a bike path. Eligible applicants include local, regional, or statewide nonprofit organizations. Public agencies may also apply, but community organizations will receive preference. Applications will only be accepted online from March 1 through June 1.
