It is the time of year when Peregrine Falcons and Merlins are migrating at their peak; swallows are coming through in phenomenal numbers. There will be opportunities to hike through the salt marshes, along the beach or quick side trips to shorebird and waterfowl staging areas. Cape May Point with its world famous light house is a buzz with activity.
